The end of a year causes us to pause to reflect. The reflection can be good as we see how God worked in and through us and the church, and the reflection can also be humbling and disappointing as we are reminded of times we did not live up to God's expectations for us.

We started 2019 with an emphasis on "Focus" and entered into our Challenge to Grow campaign. We celebrated as over \$1,000,000 was pledged and we recently completed the first step in this process! God blessed a great VBS and camp season, and we baptized more people this calendar year than any other time in at least the past decade! At one point this fall, we had four consecutive weeks of baptisms! Over 60 children continue to receive food for the weekend through the Backpack Ministry, and many of them just received Christmas gifts from you. You continue to be a trendsetter among Mississippi Baptists in missions giving and local missions involvement.

If we are honest with ourselves individually and as a church, there were times this year that we did not take advantage of an opportunity, times that we spoke too soon, times that our motives were not pure, and many other times that we fell short. Pausing to reflect will bring some conviction, where we can wallow in our self-pity or we can acknowledge the wrong and experience a fresh touch of God's grace. The choice is up to each of us, which will lead to how the church responds together.

A time of transition also causes us to pause to reflect. I have attempted to write this article for several days and have so much that I would like to say. There will be time to exchange pleasantries, but know that it has been my honor to serve as your pastor. For me, "I Love Yazoo" was more than a slogan on a shirt and a particular Sunday event; it was who I was and what I did. Some of my greatest moments of fulfillment in 18 years of pastoral ministry occurred on the church van in Shady Lane and a Backyard Bible Club in Yazoo Estates. I will

never forget the many hours my family spent on the softball fields at the complex, often with current church members or those who would eventually become church members. I got to celebrate the arrival of babies, mourn the death of saints, rejoice in the re-birth of new Christians, see spiritual growth in many, and just enjoy living life together. Then there were the Staff Infection and Walmart videos that many would like to forget but continue to live on through the internet!

I now get to encourage Arkansas Baptist churches to minister to their communities, using what I learned during my time here, and I get to encourage pastors to not give up when they feel like they are not making a difference. While I leave, the responsibility of this church to minister to its community does not change, so you must continue to focus on the task at hand. I want to share with you the same things I shared in the newsletter last January to urge you to focus properly.

F- Forward. The past cannot be changed. Rather than spending time this new year on something negative from the past, you must look ahead to the new thing that God wants to do in your life and your church.

O- Opportunities. Every obstacle you face is an opportunity to experience God at work. So is every relationship. And every victory. The opportunities are all around you.

C- Christ. Christ must remain the center of everything you do. Over the next couple of months, I pray that statement becomes more than a sentence on a page. May it be true of your lives.

U- Unity. You must work together with others so that you can have a greater Kingdom impact.

S- Souls. This is the reason you are here! Focus on what Jesus focused on.

CHILDREN'S MINISTRY

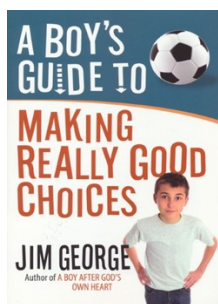

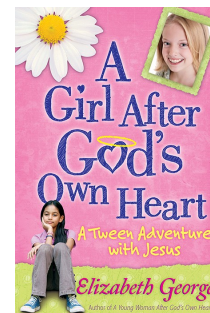
