Dear FBC Yazoo City Family of Faith,

Grace and peace to you in the name of Jesus Christ our Lord! Frank Howard, the famous football coach and athletics leader at Clemson University from days gone by, had someone come to him and wanted to start a rowing team at Clemson. They explained the sport and how athletes would sit in these specially designed boats, facing backward, and row down the waterway. Frank Howard famously replied, "No! Clemson University will not have any activity where you sit on your rear end and go backwards!"

With all the challenges Satan and the world have thrown at us this year, it would be easy to just sit down, or even retreat, and give up. But that's not what Christian servants do in the Body of Christ. Christ deserves and expects that we keep pressing and moving forward each day as individuals and as a church to find, pursue, and do His will in our lives, home, community, and church. I want to thank all of you so much for your faithfulness and commitment to continue to strive forward for the cause of Christ in and through the ministries and activities of FBC YC. It has been a real joy for Dawn and I to serve with all of you as your interim pastor, and we thank you for your love, friendship, and support.

I want to say a special thank you to your wonderful ministry staff and church leadership for their faithfulness in ministry through the interesting journey of 2020. And of course, thank you as the church family for your faithfulness and perseverance during these days as well. Please join me in expressing thanks to your church ministers, leaders, and servants every opportunity you get, and remember to pray for God's blessing, wisdom, and guidance for them each day.

We appreciate your faithfulness and help in returning back to physical worship services as safely as possible. Let's make sure to continue to be careful when we are gathering together for worship and meetings, because we are still seeing increased case numbers of the virus in our state. Please remember and follow these simple guidelines:

In worship services, we ask that families sit together as a group, spreading out throughout the fellowship hall and sanctuary, accommodating a six foot distance in all directions between you and the nearest other family/individual.

We strongly encourage people who are not feeling well, have a fever or a cough, have traveled in highly infected areas, or have been in possible contact with an infected individual, to please stay at home and worship through one of our broadcast platforms, and do not come to church worship for 14 days until you are adequately able to assess your health. Please take your temperature before you come to church, and if you have a fever, please stay at home and worship online.

Please resist greeting or fellowshipping with handshakes and hugs. Please continue to practice the 6-foot "social distancing" in our personal interactions. Also, please avoid congregating in groups in common areas inside of the church.

Pay special attention when entering and leaving the worship service to maintain the six foot social distance and not stop and congregate for an extended time. Keep the traffic flow safe and steady as you enter and exit the building.

We will continue to not pass the offering plates during an offertory, but we do have offering collection boxes at the entrance doors as you enter and leave the worship services to collect weekly offerings. Please continue to faithfully give your tithes and offerings to support the ministry of FBC Yazoo City. You can also continue to

tithe and give by mailing your offering in to the church office, through online giving on the church website, through text giving, or through bank drafts.

We greatly encourage people to wear protective masks, and even protective gloves if desired, while attending church services.

We encourage you to regularly wash your hands and use hand sanitizer often before, during, and after church.

If anyone happens to test positive for COVID-19 after attending a worship service, please inform us ASAP so we can take appropriate action in reporting and informing those in attendance and take appropriate action.

Continue to pray fervently for God's healing, blessing, protection, conviction, provision, and comfort during these difficult days for our community, state, nation, and world. Please continue to pray for our government and healthcare leaders in our state and nation as they guide us through these unprecedented times.

We will continue to have physical gatherings for worship on Sunday mornings, with a 9 a.m. worship service in the church fellowship hall, and an 11 a.m. worship service in the church sanctuary. We are asking that only people over 60 years of age attend the 9 a.m. service in the church fellowship hall, allowing our seniors a safer environment to attend worship. If you are unable or not ready to return to physical gatherings at church, please remember that the weekly broadcasts of our worship service at 11 a.m. will continue to be available through livestream on the church website (www.fbcyazoo.org), on the church's Facebook page, on radio at Power 107.1 FM, or Yazoo City Cablevision channel 72. We will continue right now to not have physical gatherings for Sunday School or small group meetings on Sundays or Wednesdays, but we are starting to have discussions about when and how this could be safely done. This will greatly depend on the progression of the virus and the recommendations from our medical and governmental leaders.

We encourage Sunday School classes and small groups to use the 10 a.m. hour on Sunday mornings to teach Sunday School through Zoom or other online/ technological options. On Wednesday nights, I will continue to lead Bible study and Prayer Meeting via Facebook Live on my Facebook page, which will then be made available through the church Facebook page. John and Tiki will also be making available teaching and fellowship times for the children and students on Wednesdays and Sundays as well through technological platforms. Lastly and importantly, please remember to pray daily for your Pastor Search Committee as they seek God's leading and direction to identify God's man to be your next pastor here at FBCYC. And continue growing in unity and focus in your lives and church to follow and obey Christ and His will above any other concern. God bless you, we love you, and please let me know if we can minister or counsel spiritually or personally to you in any way.
