Church family,

I was recently in the Smoky Mountains. A number of us hiked to the top of Mount Brushy, about 5,000 feet in elevation. The long careful journey was well worth it. The view was spectacular as we marveled at God's beautiful creation. It would have been very frustrating and possibly dangerous if in the midst of our climb something caused us to retreat, slip down, or run back down the mountain. Progress made, the view at the summit, joy that filled our hearts - all of that would have been lost.

Navigating through the Covid crisis has seemed like climbing a mountain. We have made much progress through all the twists and turns. We have taken great precautions including sanitizing, fogging, spacing out, and masking. We were beginning to see more of God's beautiful creation reappear before us – that is one another, His people, the Church – as we progressed towards all being together again. People are wondering are we about to go back to where we were when this Covid crisis started. Are we going to get knocked back down the mountain? There is a major difference this time. Many people in the United States have chosen to be vaccinated. If that person still contracts Covid the cases are not leading to the point of hospitalization or death. Many have chosen not to vaccinate. To vaccinate or not to vaccinate has unfortunately become a touchy, inflammatory, and even politicized subject. Each viewpoint should be considered carefully. Some say this (**bold**) and others say this ...

I don't trust the government.

The government didn't create the vaccines. They only funded the research. I don't trust the vaccines.

What would a drug company have to gain from making a vaccine that could potentially cost them billions in lawsuits and perhaps be the downfall of their company?

Talk to those in the medical field you trust and see what they think about the vaccine.

Talk to your Father about what you have learned and then draw your conclusion. **The vaccines did not go through the normal testing period.**

Carefully research the production process of how each vaccine was made and how people are responding to each one.

Talk to those in the medical field you trust and seek their expert analysis. Pray over what you have learned and then draw your conclusion.

I am just going to trust the LORD to keep me from getting the virus.

The LORD does amazing things for His children – including at times keeping them from getting sick and dying. There are many who walk deeply with God who get very sick and die. The LORD has revealed medical wisdom to His creation. We have vaccines and medicines that keep people alive from things that used to kill them. If you have taken one of those medications or vaccines does that mean you don't trust the LORD? Of course not.

The government is using this crisis and vaccine to condition Americans to be compliant to some future diabolical plan!

At the moment, the government is strongly promoting getting the vaccine but they are not forcing them on anyone.

If the government tells a believer to do something or attempts to force a believer to do something contrary to Scripture – then we should have a problem. Our answer as followers of Jesus Christ should be just as it was for Peter and John in

Acts 4:18-20.

I am not going to live in fear!

On this both sides in Christ should agree. Every person trusting in Jesus is His now and forever – whether a day brings life or physical death. No matter what life brings, knowing you are in Christ, enables a person to live in trust and not in fear! Take precautions as the LORD leads you and stop being afraid to breath public air whether you are vaccinated or not. Your life is in His sovereign hands.

This is just a sampling of the different viewpoints and issues to be considered. Much more could have been said. Many are still trying to navigate through these differing viewpoints and information and come to a best conclusion for themselves and/or family.

Allowing anyone to put anything into your body should be a personal decision and a well though through and prayed over decision. For parents with non-adult children, whether that child should be vaccinated or not, is a decision that should be made with much prayer, much research, and much discussion within that family and even with doctors that you deeply trust. As your pastor, I would be more than glad to talk with you as well – if that is something you and your family desires.

Covid is leaving its ugly mark again. More masks are appearing. Events are being cancelled. People are wondering, "What are we as a church going to do?" Here are some things we are and can do:

 Keep on moving full steam ahead - meeting together in Sunday School, Worship, and other opportunities in which we get together.

• Take precautions.

- -Use the many sanitizing stations in each building.
- -Wash your hands when you think it necessary.
- -Masks are available if you feel safer wearing one.
- -Sunday school teachers may want to space out the chairs again.
- -Where sanitation is needed each week, sanitation is being done.
- -Sit further apart from other people in the sanctuary.
- If a group or Sunday school class has a members who gets Covid:
 -Check with others in the week and see how they are doing.
 -If others get sick stop meeting for a couple of weeks.
 -Do NOT come back to class or church until your quarantine

period is complete.

• Be respectful of one another.

- -Respect other's decisions to get vaccinated or not.
- -Respect other's opinions to mask up or not.
- -Respect other's opinions to gather with the church body or not.

We, the pastoral staff, love each of you. We will never intentionally expose you to dangers of any kind. If we see need to take further steps to prevent the spread of this virus, then we will do so.

I am going to keep climbing the mountain. The beautiful view will be worth it! How about you?

Wow what a summer! It has been jam-packed and so much fun to see each of you grow and experience new things this summer. More so than summer, I am excited about this upcoming school year! I know that this will be the first "somewhat" normal year since COVID, but I encourage you all to take priority in being involved in church and the things going on. Above all else, we know that if we are not being spiritually nourished then we may find ourselves drowning. I pray that 3-4 months into the school year you don't find yourself in that place. Our theme this school year is "STRIVE!" This comes out of Philippians 1:27: "Only let your manner of life be worthy of the gospel of Christ, so that whether I come and see you or am absent, I may hear of you that you are standing firm in one spirit, with one mind striving side by side for the faith of the gospel."

In the verses leading up to this, Paul explained how his suffering was for the sake of Christ, and encouraged his readers with a hope of reunion. In verse 27, Paul gives the Philippians believers one assignment in advance of his hoped-for visit: live a life worthy of the gospel. This is very similar to the teaching Paul gave in Ephesians 4:1: "I therefore, a prisoner for the Lord, urge you to walk in a manner worthy of the calling to which you have been called." He says something similar in Colossians 1:10, encouraging others to live out the truth they proclaim.

Paul desires these Christians to show unity to the world. This echoes the teachings of Christ (John 17:11, 22), who emphasized the importance of love in living out the gospel (John 13:34–35). Paul is calling on his readers to live out unity, in one spirit and mind, working together "for the faith of the gospel." His goal continually remained on the gospel and its spread.

So STRIVE; what does that look like for us? Two main things we will look at this semester is first, Community.. true biblical community. My heart this semester is to see an end of consumer christianity amongst our families and students. American christians have become too comfortable with church-hopping or being very surface level Christians. So I am of the belief



that this semester we will be challenged to what that looks like not only in the church but in our very own lives. The second is being Godly examples as families and individuals. None of us is perfect and none of us have arrived. As I've been here nearly 2 years now I see a gap between a very cultural christianity, and piggy back mentality of "they are so godly ill let them do it." My prayer is that through this year we all grow as families and individuals in our heart for God. Also in our love for the Lord in our families, sparking us to serve and live out our faith within the body and beyond.


