Church Family,

What a year this has been! To many people across this nation and world the numbers 2-0-2-0 are synonymous with many adjectives that describe life at its worst – lousy, terrible, horrendous, or just downright horrible. There is no doubt that 2020 has seen unprecedented (an overused word these days) challenges and some very hard decisions. In less than a year's time we have seen the stock market plunge thousands into the red only to rebound deeper into the black than ever before, thousands of people have found themselves jobless, local restaurants and small businesses are struggling to survive (and some have not), wearing a mask has now become mandatory to go into some places (if you wore a mask in these places before Covid-19 security would have tackled you at the door!), and people have been panicking to the point that toilet paper has seen its best sales ever!

The challenges have hit the local church hard! Churches who have never livestreamed a service before have had to scramble to install the right equipment and learn how to get the services into people's homes who were now being told you can't go to church, or it is not safe to go to church! I have had more than one church member in different places let me know - "I was watching and the live-stream suddenly stopped!" I had never had that conversation until this year.

Understandably many senior adults, including my own parents, have not returned to services at the church building. I fully understand those decisions. Hopefully with a safe vaccine becoming available, that will soon change. Church staffs across this nation have prayed and tried to find ways to minister to God's people during the pandemic. To me it has been frustrating to not be able to be in the homes of shut-ins, in the nursing homes, or at one's side in the hospital.

Pastors are wondering when all is said and done – will everyone even come back when the church doors are open once again. I have talked with many pastors during the past year and every one of them is in the same spot – whatever choices they make, some people are happy and some are not. Should we have services or not? Should we require masks to be worn or not? Who would have ever thought that a mask could cause such division? Should we allow people to sing without a mask or not? Or should people even be allowed to sing at all? Pastors and church staff have spent many hours trying to decide what is the right or wrong thing to do. I cannot speak for all church staffs but I can speak for the wonderful staff of FBC Yazoo. At the heart of every decision we make is our deep love for each of you and our desire for all of us to be able to gather together as safely as possible.

We continue to provide a clean place to gather, we encourage everyone to take the necessary precautions they feel comfortable with, and to respect other people's decisions that they make for themselves. If you don't feel

comfortable returning just yet, that is okay. We will rejoice when we are together with you again!

My personal approach has been to take the necessary precautions, wear a mask when necessary, and wash my hands and use sanitizer constantly. At the same time, I refuse to live in fear of this virus that I might contract. I understand it has been deadly for far too many people. I am a child of the living God. I belong to the LORD and I do not fear death. I have talked with a number of people who have contracted Covid-19 including a very good friend who struggled with it. I prayed for him and he fully recovered. I pray for those who are currently enduring it. I refuse to live in fear of it. As with any other ailment I deal or may have to deal with in this fallen world – I am going to trust God to see me through it - if that is what He desires. I choose to stand on God's promise, "Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall trouble or hardship or persecution or famine or nakedness or danger or sword? ... No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through Him Who loved us. For I am convinced that neither death nor life (that means anything that happens between birth and death, including any sickness or virus) ... will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord (Romans 8:35, 37-38a)." I am firmly in the hands of my God. He has not given me a spirit of fear(ing) what happens or could happen to me. God is my Father and my every breath is in His wonderful hands!

I understand that 2020 will leave an unpleasant taste in many people's mouths. It is so easy to focus on the negatives of life, but there are many positives to my 2020. God has brought wonderful people and opportunities to trust Him into my life: a place to live in Amory, MS that He provided by His grace, wonderful people with whom we began life-long relationships, a church family who showed us abundant grace and love, and continued relationships in choir with whom we loved to worship. In 2020 God gave me the opportunity to serve as an interim pastor in two local churches. In one of those churches I was able to work together with that local church in responding to the Covid-19 shutdown.

In 2020 God called me to serve as your pastor! I cannot tell you what a joy it is to be getting to know and love each of you. Through 2020 God has once again shown me it is not so much your circumstances that matter. What matters is knowing God, knowing and taking Him at His word, and trusting Him with every facet of your existence. He is faithful to His children! I praise Him for 2020! I praise Him that He has called me to walk with Him and with each of you through 2021 regardless of what may come!
