It was that point of the day when the thought crosses the mind, "I need a break." I needed more than another cup of coffee. I decided to go for a walk. The cool air was invigorating and I got into a good stride. I walked and walked and walked. I walked on Jackson Avenue, Fourth Street, Grand Avenue and beyond. As I walked I found myself thinking about all the people who live in these houses. Some houses were grand and beautiful. Others were not. No matter if grand, or not; large or not; well-kept or not, one thing was the same... When you take away what people have (you name it) you are left with just people. People are all the same. We all need Jesus!

For those without Jesus Christ – they are lost and headed to an eternity away from God. For those with Christ – all are equally saved by God's grace through faith in Jesus Christ!

All the people who live in these houses are people loved by God. All are people that need Jesus. As I walked I began to wonder where these people went to church. Are the people in these homes walking in an authentic relationship with Jesus Christ? As far as I know out of the hundreds of people who live in these homes I was walking by – few to none are part of FBC. Why not?

Some "brilliant" person from years ago put two actions together and coined a phrase. If a person is walking and praying at the same time then they are "Prayer Walking." The prayers on that walk are very specific. Prayer Walking means you are praying for the people within those homes. You are praying for their salvation, for their family, for any hurts and pains, that they would come to walk with the LORD, for peace and love to permeate their homes, and so forth.

I have Prayer Walked with other believers in many places in this world. God only knows the impact such prayers have had on the people in those homes, communities, and cities. I firmly believe when God's child prays, then God moves according to His will. I firmly believe there is some level of impact because God's child prayed!

When is the last time you, we the people of FBC, have walked the streets around the FBC campus? Do you know the people at our doorstep? When, if ever, have we as a church Prayer Walked the streets around FBC or even through the city of Yazoo? Are we too busy to do so? I am not casting stones. If I was, then the first one

would need to strike me because this is the first time I have Prayer Walked the streets and homes surrounding FBC. Do we believe God would move in these people's lives if we took the time to walk by their homes and pray for them? Do we love our direct-right-beside-FBC neighbors as God has loved us? It is easy to say and not so easy to find the time to show.

Am I calling out to us to begin to Prayer Walk the streets around FBC and even throughout the city? Perhaps this is what God would use to stir the hearts of the people in these homes, bring light into darkness, and be a catalyst for awakening and revival in these homes and this city. What do you think? Is this a worthy investment of our time, energy, and soles in 2022?

I have prayer walked a very specific area a number of times. That area encompasses Jackson Avenue, Fourth Street, Webster Street, and Fifth Street. This is the perimeter around the park across from Word of Faith Church and Webster Elementary School. This is where we are to jointly host what is being called a "Holly Jolly Block Party." We are partnering with Word of Faith Church. Pastor Edward Taylor and I are working on establishing a friendship. We believe God is calling us to do something together for the Kingdom of God and for the people who surround Word of Faith Church and First Baptist Church. All the details are being worked out through joint meetings between our two churches. When you hear "we need this or that for the Holly Jolly Block Party," please for the Kingdom and Glory of God, for partnering with Word of Faith, for the people that are at our front and back doors, say "yes, what can I do to help!?"

The Block Party is scheduled for December 18, 2021 from 1:00 p.m. - 4:00 p.m. in Lintonia park: beside Webster Elementary School and across from Word of Faith Church. Please begin to pray now. If God leads, go ahead and invest your time, energy, and soles for His Kingdom and Glory, and for His moving in the souls all around us – start walking and praying!
