Church family,

It has been one year since the ruling of Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health overturned the infamous Roe v. Wade decision of 1973. This decision returned the discussion, as to allow abortion or not, back to each state. Abortion on demand is still far from ended in this nation. As with many issues of our day, abortion continues to greatly divide the United States of America. When the Dobbs decision was handed down it became clearer how deep and wide the divide between pro-life and prochoice Americans actually is.

Every state now had decisions to make. Some state legislators immediately began steps to end on-demand abortions in their states and have achieved that goal. Other states began to advertise across the nation, "come over here for your abortion!"

For some, the erroneous conclusion was reached, "the abortion issue has been settled." That is far from reality. One year later the protests, the arguing, the huffing and puffing still continues on the nation's streets, at abortion clinics, at crisis pregnancy centers, on courthouse steps, in homes, and even at times in churches.

Where do Americans now stand? As of May 2023 the latest Gallup poll reveals Americans are 44% prolife, 52% prochoice, with 4% verbalizing no opinion. Steven Ertelt of <u>LifeNews.com</u> thinks the numbers for prolife are even higher. He concludes that, "49% of Americans oppose 100% of abortions, or they oppose 98% of abortions [with the exceptions of incest, rape, or to save the life of the mother]. So, half of America takes a pro-life position, and that number has increased since this time last year." In the words of lifesitenews.com, "Abortion-free states, rising birth numbers, shuttered abortion centers, and countless babies saved: There's a lot to be excited about in post-Roe America." FiveThirtyEight statistics reveal more good news - there were approximately 24,000 fewer abortions in the United States in the year following the Dobbs decision! Still, thousands of tiny human beings did not have the same opportunity for continued life beyond the womb.

Though there are fewer abortion facilities and an increasing number of states who are passing legislation in favor of life – there is another method of abortion that is on the rise – medication abortions. The FDA has approved abortion pills to be safe up until the tenth week of pregnancy. According to most estimates abortions through the usage of pills now accounts for approximately 50% of abortions in the United States.

One would hope getting such pills would be very difficult. The accessibility of and regulations of these pills has been a hot issue of debate including by the Supreme Court over the past year. Increasing attention is being drawn to the fact that too many girls/women who take these pills are experiencing bad to terrible side effects ranging from emergency surgery, hospitalization, and even death.

State regulations for medication abortions are all over the place. According to a June 2023 article by the Guttmacher institute:

• 15 states require that medication abortion be provided by a physician.

• 5 states require the patient to have an in-person visit with a physician.

- 1 state has a gestational age limit on medication abortion provision.
- 1 state requires that the first of the two-drug regimen for medication abortion be taken in the presence of a physician. 1 state bans mailing pills for medication abortion to a patient.

How have we slidden to such a dark place in America where one can now order by mail medication to kill your own child in the womb? The more Americans realize what is happening with medication abortions the more upset they are becoming. They are alarmed that many medication abortions are not even being overseen by a physician. Just order some pills and hope for the best seems to be the message being sent by some! The girls and young women taking these pills are not only killing the child but too often harming themselves. With good reason there is an increasing demand for stricter guidelines for who can get these pills, how and when they are administered, and by whom. Thankfully we live in a state where the people through their representatives have already signed into law - there will be no abortions provided in Mississippi. In fact, Mississippi is one of 14 states who have a total ban on abortion.

Roe v. Wade has been overturned yet the battle rages on. As followers of Jesus Christ we are called to be salt and light. God desires to shake us out of the "saltshaker" into the rotting society around us and to shine His light through us into the darkest places in people's lives. May we be willing servants of our LORD! Here are some concrete ways we can be salt and light:

- Praise God for His continued movement through His children who bring a message of love, hope, and life for anyone who will listen.
- Continue to cast your vote for those who will stand for and value human life from conception to one's last breath.
- Speak truth in love into our families and friends who may have a different view on abortion.
- Stand up for the innocent who cannot speak for themselves. How?
 -Support Crisis pregnancy centers e.g. the Center for Pregnancy Choices [cpcmetrofriends.org] in Jackson, MS.
 -Support such organizations as preborn.com who provide free ultrasounds to those contemplating abortion.
- Encourage any mom with an unexpected or unwanted pregnancy to choose life. Individually and as a church body may we live out grace to her and support her in any way the LORD leads.
- Pray for girls and women across this nation who are thinking of destroying the precious life of their unborn child.
