Church Family,

I want to take a moment and remind all of us of a great opportunity beginning October 1st. The Men's Ministry is hosting a church-wide sit-down breakfast in the Fellowship Hall. This will be a time to sit across from each other again and share our hearts, encourage each other, and rejoice together in the LORD! This is also a time of "kicking off" a 7-week Sunday School emphasis. Here are the goals that were shared with Sunday School teachers on September 10, 2023:

1. Reclaim the power of presence by making it a priority to be faithful in Sunday School attendance!
2. Discover the joy of fellowship in God's house with God's people!
3. Grow as disciples through the study of God's word!
4. Seek to find and involve others to become a part of our Sunday School classes!

Each class is being encouraged to set a goal to see an increase of participation in their Sunday School class. Each class is encouraged to pray and then seek out new members. - Deep trust, and confidence in one another, is formed in our hearts which leads to more openness and even a willingness to be vulnerable with one another.
- Deep love is formed in the hearts of those that gather, as week after week, they walk with the LORD and walk together through life.
- Deepening relationships are the natural byproduct of a group of people who love the LORD together,

study His word together, submit to His truth together, share their hearts with one another, pray together, encourage one another, and so forth.

Together with the LORD let us do what we can and trust Him to do what only He can! As we see God move let's celebrate the great things He has done!

On November 12th we will be celebrating High Attendance Day in Sunday School. We will also be coming together for a wonderful Thanksgiving meal as we praise God from Whom all blessings flow! I am looking forward to being with you then!

One other thing in October that we need to focus on is our Quarterly Business Luncheon which will be held after worship on October 15th. Our quarterly gatherings are very important for making sure we are all aware of things happening in and through FBC Yazoo, making sure we are moving forward together according to God's will, and these gatherings can also be times of declaring great trust and praise in our Heavenly Father and encouraging one another!

In the past the church has provided the meal for these gatherings. Due to rising food prices the cost for these meals has already exceeded money annually allocated for such costs. 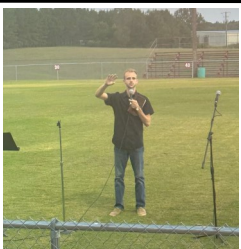

A Note from your Pastor of Family Ministries

Choices and decisions are just a part of life. Perhaps one of the most obvious statements ever, but have you paused and tried to add up all the decisions you make in one day? This would be a very difficult task at best, wouldn't it? From personal day preparations, to family decisions and those things you must choose to do as a parent. Some are easy, and some not so much. Some make you the hero (in your child's eyes) and some make you the arch villain, the worst person in the world. Such is life.

Sometimes the craziness of life, the multiple schedules between work, sports, and homework, just leaves you, as the parents, exhausted and sometimes frustrated. Have you ever had someone look at you from across a table or over coffee and say, "I know just how you feel." That just seems to make it better somehow although the situation hasn't changed. You've just realized that you aren't the only one.

That's the community that is your Sunday School class and Wednesday night Bible Study. Someone that no matter what you are experiencing, will be in that group and can look at you with real empathy having experienced the same thing. This support helps you "weather the storm" and this community provides a place to grow spiritually. Pollster George Barna puts it this way:

- "...if people's faith is objectively measured against a biblical standard of how faith is to be practiced, Americans are spiritually lukewarm. Very limited effort is devoted to spiritual growth. Most Americans experience 'accidental spiritual growth' since there is generally no plan or process other than showing up at a church and absorbing a few ideas here and there. Even then, few people have a defined understanding of what they are hoping to become, as followers of Christ." Barna attributed much of this to the numerous distractions common in most people's lives.

Your spiritual growth should be a priority. Barna addresses the effect this has on your child;

- "Seven out of ten parents claim they are effective at developing the spiritual maturity of their children, but the Barna survey among 8-to-12-year-olds discovered that only one-third of them say a church has made "a positive difference" in their life; one-third contend that prayer is very important in their life; most of them would rather be popular than to do what is morally right. In fact, "tweeners" (those ages 8 to 12) deem their family and only one out of every three say it is easy for them to talk to their parents about things that matter to them."

The programs we have put in place for the spiritual growth of you and your children are not just thrown together but have a lot of prayer and intent behind it. Make the commitment today to put your family's attendance on the top of the family priority list.
